

\$240M in tax credits, grants, loans, and technical assistance to increase food access and develop new approaches to alleviate food deserts.



Food Retail Innovation in Delivery Grant

\$2.5M grant program to assist New Jersey food retailers to purchase refrigerated lockers to expand access to grocery delivery within FDCs.



CSIT Food & Agriculture R&D Grant

\$75,000 grants for early-stage start-ups focused on developing new innovations and solutions that address food insecurity.

THE FOOD DESERT RELIEF ACT

The Food Desert Relief Act is part of the **New Jersey Economic Recovery Act of 2020 (ERA)**, a package of tax incentive, financing, and grant programs Governor Murphy signed into law in January 2021 to address the ongoing economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and build a stronger, fairer New Jersey economy.



Facilitate development, construction, and sustainable operations of new supermarkets and grocery stores



Strengthen existing community assets by equipping them with the necessary equipment and infrastructure to provide healthier food options



Help food retailers respond to the shift to e-commerce, including for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)



Identify and foster innovative solutions to alleviate food insecurity








New Healthy Food Stores in the District of Columbia Wards 7 & 8



FOOD BILL OF RIGHTS

We proclaim this Declaration of the Food Bill of Rights as a guiding framework for food policies, programs and practices towards the betterment of nutritional, economic and health status of Americans. The Food Bill of Rights informs, advocates and promotes respect and dignity of every individual and every families. While this Food Bill of Rights has been created with Americans in mind.

ARTICLE 1

We have the right to food that values biodiversity, sustainability, and wellbeing to achieve optimal wellness.

ARTICLE 2

We have the right to equitable access to safe, cultural, affordable, and nourishing foods and nutrition education.

ARTICLE 3

We have the right to civic and economic participation in the food system as part of a food democracy.

ARTICLE 4

We have the right to a fair food environment in alignment health, livelihood and the planet.

ARTICLE 5

We have the right to reclaim and reproduce our heritage foods, values, history and knowledge.

ARTICLE 6

We have the right to resist any narratives and social, economical, health and labor conditions that limit our food freedom.

ARTICLE 7

We have the right to receive and give food with respect and dignity.

New Jersey's 50 Food Desert Communities

- The FDRA directed EDA to work with the Departments of Community Affairs and Agriculture to **designate up to 50 areas of the state as Food Desert Communities**
- Designations were informed by a combination of rigorous, data-driven analysis and community input
- More than 1.5 million NJ residents live in a Food Desert Community (FDC)
- **All 21 counties** have at least one FDC
- FDC designations include 57 municipalities
 - In most cases, just *portions* of a municipality are included in FDC designation, not the whole municipality
- 6 municipalities (Camden, Jersey City, Lakewood, Newark, Paterson, Trenton) are subdivided due to the size of the population residing in an FDC
- Population size of each FDC ranges from 1,135 to 69,264



What is a Food Desert Community?

Based on literature reviews and community input, NJDCA performed a **factor analysis** to identify the variables that together best signal the presence of a Food Desert Community.

What is the Food Retail Innovation in Delivery Grant (FRIDG)?

- Subsidizing the cost of self-contained, temperature-controlled lockers for food retailers to place within designated Food Desert Communities (FDCs), up to \$250,000
- Intended to increase deliveries into FDCs where residents may not have easy access to a grocery store
- Targeted toward retailers that already are certified to accept SNAP benefits online to allow for low-income SNAP beneficiaries in FDCs to place online orders to the locker units
- Program will serve as a time-limited pilot to help inform future programming under the Food Desert Relief Act







SUSTAIN & SERVE NJ



Sustain and Serve NJ (SSNJ) gives money to nonprofit organizations to buy meals from NJ-based restaurants and distribute those meals for free to community members

Money can be used to support the direct cost of meals and operating costs for the nonprofit

Grantees have ranged from new grassroots efforts that sprang up in direct response to COVID to large, established organizations

Phases 1 and 2 of the program awarded nearly \$34 million to organizations throughout the state

Phase 3 of the program awarded over \$22 million in grant to organizations throughout the state


